

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Justice, justice alone shall you pursue, so that you may live and possess the land the Lord, your God, is giving you." (Deuteronomy 16:20)

This year's theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity invites us to meditate on the importance of connecting proper worship of God with setting right our relationships with others. Over and over, the prophets of ancient Israel communicated God's command to care for those who are in need and to respect all people, the foreigner as well as the Israelite. Right worship and right relationship is not foreign to the New Testament. They are given flesh in Jesus Christ. When asked by a scribe what the greatest commandment is, the Lord responds: "The first is this: 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." It is not enough to love God in worship, one must also love Him in other people.

Saints throughout history – Our Blessed Lady, Vincent de Paul, Peter Claver, Damien of Molokai, Teresa of Calcutta, Oscar Romero – testify that right worship and right relationship call us to seek justice. Dr. Martin Luther King, whom we honor this Monday, also recognized this truth. It scandalized him that a presumably Christian nation would deny rights to a segment of her populace because of race. "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere," Dr. King once wrote from the Birmingham City jail, "We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in single garment of destiny."

Let this connection between the theme of this Week of Prayer and the work of Dr. King remind us that we are called to pray and work for a fair and equitable society. We not only help others carry their cross, but also seek to change some of the structures that lay burdens on them. How much more powerful a witness could that be if Christians can face these challenges together ~ Fr. Jiw

When Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated, the outcry from other faith leaders was immediate. Pope Paul VI called King a "prophet." The National Conference of Catholic Bishops joined in a widespread interfaith statement, "bow[ing] together in grief before the shameful murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., a unique apostle of the nonviolent drive for justice . . . no service of remembrance or local memorial is equal to the greatness of his labor or the vastness of our national need." What can your parish do with other churches in the ongoing effort to end racism?

DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN

Remember the us in them

At the heart of Roe v. Wade, the U.S. Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion, is the abbreviation v., "versus," the antagonism, the eternal contest between "us" and "them." Our great challenge in choosing life over death is less to beat "them" whom we can easily demonize as the "opposition" but rather to see those with whom we profoundly disagree as persons also beloved by God and saved by "The Lord [who] does not see as mortals see, the outward appearance, but the Lord [who] looks on the heart." Part of the struggle to uphold the sanctity and value of life must be to draw close enough to the other to actually listen to and hear another human heart.

TODAY'S READINGS: Hebrews 6:10-20; Mark 2:23-28 (312). "They look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."

Working together to heal the world

In developing countries around the world, missionaries of every Christian denomination work side by side to help the poor, the hungry, and the sick. Projects that provide water and medical services to remote villages are accomplished every day by people cooperating despite their religious differences. Jesus encountered resistance to his own healing ministry because he often had to cross the dividing lines of religion in order to get the job done. In this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity we may not be able to share the sacrament of Communion, but we can share the work of justice, which ultimately is the work of Jesus.

Saint Francis de Sales, a French bishop born in 1567, is also part of the esteemed group, and he is known as the "doctor of charity." He wrote extensively (and is the patron saint of journalists), emphasizing to his readers that charity is a means of spiritual development. Take a page from Saint Francis today.

I once was (and often am) blind

Sometimes it seems Paul was lucky. God made it very clear to him that he needed a major attitude adjustment—what spiritual folks call a conversion of heart. If God met you on the road today, could you meet the divine gaze with a sense of peace, or would you want to beg for a second chance to live more faithfully? In prayer today ask, "Am I blind to my own need for conversion?" Pray for the grace to honestly see and to "respond to the merciful love of God who loved us first," in the words of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Other Projects In The Works

As we await the arrival of the side door railings, we are moving ahead with other projects on our Phase I list. Last week we signed engineering and design contracts for work on the auditorium. Existing restrooms will be redesigned to accommodate adults, as well as the school children they were originally built for. In addition, plans call for using the old coffee / dishwashing area of the kitchen for an ADA compliant restroom.

In the kitchen, new refrigeration, a coffee area and dishwashing will be added. The water system will be





redesigned to add a dedicated hot water system.

The installation of an up-to-date exhaust system with fire suppressant will allow us to install a stove and ovens allowing us to prepare food for parish functions.

At the same time, work continues on designing the Parish Center heating system's conversion to gas. No other work, can take place there until the weather does not require heating and until gas service is brought to the building. We await news on our place on PSEG's schedule of our service installation.

- Add Handicapped Parking spaces and Re-coat & re-stripe the Parking lot
 - Install new padding on the kneelers

PHASE III

Fall 2020

Approximate Cost: \$210,000

• Update Fire and Security Alarm systems in the Church and Parish Center
