#### Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Over these first weeks of May, we have celebrated the milestone sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation with some of the younger members of our parish. The second graders showed a lot of excitement. The eighth graders tended to act "cool" and not react to what is important to adults. But they put a lot of effort into their preparation. Every Spring, then, we experience something that is familiar in a new way, with children experiencing something new.

The word "new" occurs in all of our readings today. In the first reading, St. Paul and St. Barnabas bring the "good news" to people in what is now Turkey. Their message is received with great rejoicing. In our second reading, St. John speaks of "a new heaven and a new earth." This vision reveals that God's dwelling place will be with his people. No longer will there be any darkness or any separation. And God's promise is: "Behold, I make all things new."

Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus says, "I give you a "new commandment": love one another." But, what is so new about that? The commands to love God with all our hearts and our neighbor as ourselves are in the Hebrew scripture, written hundreds of years before Jesus was born. But Jesus's addition: "As I love you, so you also should love one another" shows that God's eternal plan is to bring something fresh and enlivening to every age. For to love this way means that each of us needs to get to know the Lord more and more in a personal way. In doing so, we bring unique and personal dimensions to this expression of love. This command to love doesn't mean that God only recently adopted new standards but that we can now view the old commandments through a more perfect lens: the Lord Jesus accompanying us throughout our lives. \*Fr.\*\* J\u00fcm\u00fc

#### Life is hard—find a community!

Moving day is proof positive that we could all use some friends. Who else is going to lift the other end of that piano? But the rewards of community go beyond bearing the physical burden. MEMORIAL OF BERNARDINE OF SIENA, PRIEST

#### It's good to evolve

Bernardine of Siena (1380-1444) was known as a gifted preacher. But many of his sermons were polemics against Jews and homosexual peoples. The cultural, political, and religious context of his time gave tacit approval to such invective. But Catholic thinking today has evolved. The catechism now teaches that people with same-sex attraction "must be accepted with respect, compassion and sensitivity" (#2358). And, according to the catechism, the church "enjoys a link" with the Jewish people, the "first to hear the word of God" (#839). Do you hold assumptions about others that need to be reexamined?

#### **Tuesday, May 21, 2019**

MEMORIAL OF CHRISTOPHER MAGALLANES, PRIEST, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS

#### Dying to find a better way

Christopher Magallanes was a priest in Mexico during a difficult time in Mexican history. On the heels of the Mexican Revolution of 1910-17, the Catholic Church and the Mexican state were at loggerheads. Magallanes wrote and preached against armed rebellion but was falsely accused of promoting armed uprising during what came to be called the Cristero Rebellion. Arrested in 1927 on his way to celebrate Mass, he gave his few possessions—as well as absolution—to his executioners. His last words were, "I die innocent and ask God that my blood may serve to unite my Mexican brethren." Since 1929 church and state in Mexico have by and large avoided further violent conflict and are on much better terms than in the past. Pray for peaceful resolutions to conflicts in the world today.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 14:19-28; John 14:27-31a (286). "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

#### Wednesday, May 22, 2019

MEMORIAL OF RITA OF CASCIA, RELIGIOUS

#### Persist in your faith

Margharita was the only child of a late 14th-century Italian couple. Rita, as she was known, was a 12-year-old bride to a difficult husband, the mother of two sons, and an early widow whose husband was killed in a violent vendetta. Upon the later deaths of her sons, Rita entered the Augustinian monastery in her

hometown of Cascia. Biographers write of her having been a persistent woman of faith who refused to give up a dream of monastic life as well as a peacemaker who reconciled the warring factions that contributed to her husband's death. All agree that she became known as a mystic whose devotion to Christ's suffering produced a wound on her forehead as she ministered to the sick and counseled the steady stream of visitors to the convent. In her memory, let's ask today for grace that empowers us to persistence in faith and peacemaking in relationships.

#### The tie that binds

What comes to mind when you think of *love*? Maybe it's the deep connection you have with a loved one. Jesus talked about love in this way: The close relationship he had to the Father was the one he had with his disciples. He also gave us an example of a love that respects others, is patient, and is willing to make sacrifices for the good of others. Love, then, is about both contemplation and action: entering the bond you have with Jesus and the Father and also responding to it. Christ said another thing about love: It makes you happy. There's a unique joy in loving others. Find it today.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 15:7-21; John 15:9-11 (288). "I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete."

#### May church and state coexist in peace

In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI released a letter to the 9 million Catholics in China, in which he dedicated May 24 each year as a World Day of Prayer for the Church in China. The Holy Father wrote, "the Catholics of the whole world . . . will demonstrate their fraternal solidarity and solicitude for you, asking the Lord of history for the gift of perseverance in witness, in the certainty that your sufferings past and present for the Holy Name of Jesus and your intrepid loyalty to his Vicar on earth will be rewarded." Pray today that the contentious relations between China and the Catholic Church continue to improve.

While we know him as the source of much of early English history, he was also a great student of scripture and a teacher. Church history, scripture—these are two important areas to know something about to have a better grasp of your faith. Find some books on the subject, like *A Concise History of the Catholic Church* by Thomas Bokenkotter and *Invitation to the Old Testament* and *Invitation to the New Testament*, both by Alice L. Camille.


Augustine Institute produces a variety of inspiring CDs and best-selling Catholics books. There are a number of them conveniently available in our main lobby.





The furnace will be replaced and the circulator pumps updated so we do not need to place catering pans under them to catch drips. We will also be able to remediate the oil tank in the yard next to the


