**Abstinence: All from the age of seven onwards abstain from meat on these days.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The Gospel of this Fifth Sunday of Lent is one of hope. The obvious sign is the Raising of Lazarus from the dead. Not to be overlooked is the way that Martha shows that her bonds of faith in and love of Jesus are not broken in the face of a great loss.

The miracle reveals that Jesus, their close friend and teacher, truly is the Lord of Life. But for us this year, a happy ending is far away from what we are going through. And so, Martha's words before the miracle are closer to where we are. "Lord, if you had been here, our brother would not have died." How often we ask ourselves where is the Lord in all this suffering and disorientation caused by the pandemic? Where are his signs that he is here? We need to remember that Martha's words are not a complaint or judgment of Jesus. She continues by expressing her faith that his presence makes a difference, "even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." She does not understand why Jesus did not come as quickly as she expected, but not understanding does not take her faith away.

Today, we see the routines of our lives turned upside down. We need to isolate ourselves as best as we can, even avoiding something as simple as touching and being close to those outside our immediate circle. We cannot do "I am the resurrection and the Life."

our work as we would like or at all. For some there is a deep worry about the future and for those we are responsible for. In this situation, let us follow the examples of Martha in the Gospel, Mary at the Annunciation, Joseph in taking Mary as his wife, and especially Jesus himself in the Garden of Gethsemane and be willing to speak our questions and confusions honestly, but holding fast to our trust that God is with us.

Your grandparents made it through much tougher times during the depression and World War II. If this is not an opportunity to show the power of prayer and faith, I do not know what is.

Praying the Rosary

6. FIVE DECADES

1. SIGN OF THE CROSS

4. 3 BEADS

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the *Glory Be*
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten *Hail Mary*'s while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*.

After saying the five decades, say the *Hail, Holy Queen*, followed by this dialogue and prayer:

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Five Joyful Mysteries are

traditionally prayed on Mondays, Saturdays, and, during the season of Advent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Annunciation
- 2. The Visitation
- 3. The Nativity
- 4. The Presentation in the Temple
- 5. The Finding in the Temple

The **Five Sorrowful Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Tuesdays, Fridays, and, during the season of Lent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Agony in the Garden
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross
- 5. The Crucifixion and Death

The **Five Glorious Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Wednesdays and, outside the seasons of Advent and Lent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Resurrection
- 2. The Ascension
- 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit
- 4. The Assumption
- 5. The Coronation of Mary

The **Five Luminous Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Thursdays:

- 1. The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana
- 3. Jesus' Proclamation of the Coming of the Kingdom of God
- 4. The Transfiguration
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist
