

Thank you to all who so generously give to the support of our parish. You are returning to God what God has so generously given to you.



PARISH MEMBERSHIP: We welcome all new parishioners! We ask them to register at the Parish Center and encourage the use of weekly envelopes. If you are moving, please notify the office.

MARRIAGES: Couples should make arrangements in person at least one year in advance for required interview. At least one of the parties must live within the parish boundaries, or be a registered member of the parish. Please call the Parish Center for an appointment. No dates will be set over the telephone.

BAPTISMS: Prospective parents should telephone the Parish Center about three months before the expected birth to discuss the arrangements for your child's baptism and enroll you in the required baptismal class. Baptism classes are held monthly on the 1st or 2nd Sunday of the month. The baptism date will be set at the time of the class. The child's birth certificate as well as the godparent's "sponsor certificate" (godparents must be Confirmed practicing Catholics) must be presented before a date is finalized.

Muriel Lester

Peacemaker (1883–1968)



As a young child of privilege growing up in England, Muriel Lester had an experience that changed her life. While traveling by train in her first-class carriage, she glanced out the window at a rabbit warren of unsavory houses in London's East End. "Do people live there?" she asked. "Yes," said her nanny. "But you needn't worry about them. They don't mind it. They're not like you." Years later, she found opportunities to visit and know the people who lived there and to discover that they were, in fact, just like her—though thinner, paler, and destined to live short lives of worry and want. Muriel left her privileged life behind to devote herself to befriending these people, to sharing their lives and enlarging their hopes.

She established a community center called Kingsley Hall. Though rooted in the Gospels, the community was independent; it was simply "a fellowship based on the attempt to practice the presence of God." She became a tireless promoter of her causes—whether for the poor, the rights of women, the message of nonviolence, or the cause of Indian Independence. "The job of a peacemaker," she said, "is to stop war, to purify the world . . . to find God in everything and in everyone." She befriended Gandhi, who insisted on staying with her while in London negotiating with the Crown.

She maintained her balance through a practice of contemplative prayer, believing this was a discipline anyone could follow, "while you dress, bathe, brush your hair, walk to work or sit in the bus." Lester died on February 11, 1968.

"We should stop praying the Lord's Prayer until we can see that we are tied to the same living tether not only with our fellow countrymen but with everybody on the planet." —Muriel Lester

Due to the need for privacy without using an enclosed room, parishes have had to be creative in finding a suitable space for hearing confessions. We will be using the Parish Center foyer. The red front door will be propped open and a screen will be inside, between the priest and the penitent. There will be no chair or kneeler since we could not disinfect them. You simply come in, stay standing, confess, receive your penance and depart.



If you see someone in the foyer, do not come up the walkway! Remain on the sidewalk (or in your car) to keep a safe distance.

The Distribution of Holy Communion

- The Precious Blood will not be available to the faithful.
- There will be two stations for receiving Communion at the front of the side aisles. A small table and kneeler will be at each communion station in the front of the church. Priest and EM will sanitize their hands at these tables BEFORE distributing Communion.
- All are asked to remain in their seats until directed by the ushers. The people in the rear pews will go up first. They should not remove their face covering until immediately before approaching the minister to receive Holy Communion, allowing their hands to be free. Holy Communion may not be distributed with gloves, nor may it be received in the hand if a member of the faithful is wearing gloves. At the Communion Station, they should extend their hands (non-writing hand on top of dominant hand). The minister will say, "The Body of Christ" and place the host on the extended hand. Use the dominant hand to place the Eucharist in your mouth and immediately replace your mask.
- Anyone requiring reception on the tongue will need to stand behind the kneeler at the station until the minister has completed distributing the Eucharist. Ministers must sanitize their hands after each distribution of the Eucharist on the tongue.

Offertory Support through ONLINE BILL PAY

is the form of Electronic Giving we have been using in the parish. Your bank offers this service, sending money out of your bank account to whomever you wish. ONLINE BILL PAY services will print an <u>actual check</u> and mail it to St. Margaret of Scotland. Sending your regular Offertory support electronically will save you time and money.

It is an easy way to continue your support of St Margaret of Scotland Parish during this difficult time. Your Bank **does not charge** a fee for this service. You have complete control of your funds, starting, stopping and changing at your will. We have no access to your accounts, receiving only what you wish. If you pay your bills this way currently, you know how easy it is.

 Schedule payments for desired frequency (weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly: 52x, 26x, 12x).

The side steps were done last Fall. Due to less daylight hours and some construction personnel problems, actions were taken that we were not comfortable with from the beginning. Water pooled on some of the steps and the concrete work was not up to par. The company tried to do some spot repairs, but none of them were able to deal with the most important problems.

Thus, working with the Diocese, we were able to get the company to agree to remove the current landings and steps (not the railings or the heating coils, which are fine) and rebuild them from scratch. The work has been finalized successfully!
