



At the end of Holy Week, we mark Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Together, these three days are referred to as the Sacred Triduum. We use this expression because the three days in question are sacred, more sacred than other days because Jesus has undergone His Passion and death by which He demonstrates His love for us to the end.

I suggest that we have a mini triduum beginning on October 31st and continuing until November 2nd. The first obvious difference is that this mini triduum is related to specific dates on the calendar, whereas the Sacred Triduum does not have fixed dates on the calendar. The second difference is that Halloween is not *per se* a sacred day; it is largely a cultural observance today with the most common memory being that children go from house to house receiving sweets from homeowners.

There is the phenomenon though of dressing up in costumes. And one of the more popular costumes for Halloween is the skeleton. The skeleton tells us what happens to us following death. Our bodies decompose; our skin and hair disappear and all that is left are our bones.

The skeleton costume reminds us of our mortality – the great equalizer as we like to say. Nobody is exempt. No one can do an end-around death. At some point or other, death comes for each and every one of us.

The fact that we die raises the matter of the significance of our earthy lives. For whom do we live and how should we live? We live for God and we live according to His commandments and precepts.

Living for God and living according to His commandments and precepts is an invitation to become a saint.

Whether we live saintly – partly or wholly – is determined by what we do with our freedom. Heaven and earth are joined first by Christ but secondarily by the men and women who have arrived at their destinations within the Communion of Saints. These men and women, canonized and not canonized, help us with their prayers and intercession. There is an inexhaustible treasury of merit at our disposal and it makes perfectly good sense that we avail ourselves of it.

On the second day of our mini triduum, we hear at Mass the proclamation of the Gospel of the Beatitudes. With each beatitude, we are told that those who live in the way enjoined are blessed; they have the favor of God. Reaching heaven is the capstone of that blessing. Our efforts are important then, but God's grace is what is most responsible for being counted among the elect, those who have had their robes washed by the blood of the Lamb. (cf. Rev 7:14)

On the third day of our mini triduum, we are reminded once again of our death with All Souls Day. This annual commemoration gives us an opportunity to help deceased loved ones by praying for them. We who desire to see them again for all eternity begin to rejoice at that reunion just by having the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered for them. As I said in a previous column, the Holy Eucharist makes atonement for the sins of the deceased. Every celebration of the Holy Eucharist contains that purifying love of Christ. For those souls not yet ready to enter heaven, the Mass is very much needed. Let us not forget the infinite fruits of what Christ Himself gave us.

Not one of the days of the Sacred Triduum is a Holy Day of Obligation. In the mini triduum, sometimes the Solemnity of All Saints is a day of precept (not this year, however). Let us be grateful for the gift of time now which beckons us to look ahead to that life which is outside of time – eternity.


