As we continue to keep abreast of all the things which go along with the opening of a new school year, and all of the schedule changes which follow after Labor Day, I want to bring the following matters to your attention.

**September 11<sup>th</sup>:** Ever since the attack on our country in 2001 and the more than three thousand people who perished in the acts of terrorism then, this date stands out. We are all able to recall what we were doing when we learned of the attack, sometimes down to the smallest details. Some of us knew people who were murdered on that day, some of us were working in New York City and ran for our lives as the towers fell. For weeks after, we participated in funeral rites for victims and did what we could to comfort the grieving families who lost parents, sons and daughters, and others who lost neighbors and friends. It is good that we never forget that horrible day. It is good that we commit once again to be vigilant in our defense of life and dedicate ourselves to be peacemakers in the spirit of that Beatitude in the Gospels. May we not fail to be the good servants who remain ready to constrain evil, and embody justice and mercy in our witness to the Kingdom which Christ wants us to build with lives of holiness.

October 2<sup>nd</sup>: This year because it is a Sunday, we do not mark the Memorial of the Guardian Angels liturgically. Instead, it is the 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is also Respect Life Sunday. I encourage you to remember the unborn children whose lives have been taken through abortion since its legalization by the Supreme Court in 1973. As you know, the Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs* a few months ago reversed *Roe*, and abortion remains now a matter for the states to decide through their legislative bodies. We continue to be grateful for the Supreme Court outcome in *Dobbs*. But we cannot become complacent. The pro-life cause always needs your support, especially in a State like New York. Learn about how you can help in the various *Life Centers* which are located in Long Island.

Besides the assistance to be rendered to women who are faced with unplanned pregnancies, we need also to win many others to our side so that the culture of life may take a deeper hold in our society. In this area, we still have a very long way to go. And so, I encourage you to participate in something called **Stand Up for Life** which is held every first Sunday in October. Stand up for Life is a prayerful, public witness to the sanctity of unborn life. Pro-life men and women gather in places on Long Island where there is high visibility because of constant vehicular traffic. One of those places is Route 110 in Melville.

This prayerful, public witness begins at 2:00 PM and concludes at 3:30 PM – rain or shine! Consider going by yourself or with a group. I will be there.

**Mission Cooperative Appeal:** The last weekend in September, the 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, has been designated as the time for the Claretian Missionaries of East Nigeria to preach the annual appeal. Fr. Innocent will be here at Saint Margaret to conduct that appeal.

I ask you to remember the Church's missions in your prayers and to support those same missions financially with the treasure portion of your stewardship.

**Mass Intentions:** As you know, Masses at Saint Margaret have what we call Mass Intentions, and that would be persons who are remembered at the altar and whose names are mentioned in the Prayer of the Faithful. All of our weekend Masses have Intentions as does our daily Mass at 9:00 AM Monday through Friday.

I encourage you to consider a deceased love one (relative or friend) on the occasion of that person's death or some other important date (e.g. birthday) and arrange for the Holy Sacrifice to be offered at the parish office during regular business hours. Mass Intentions are not only for the deceased; nevertheless, most of the Intentions are in fact for those who have died.

The very best way to help a deceased relative or friend is to assist in having him or her be counted among the saints in heaven. That is what the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass does for those who are no longer with us on earth. We refer to that spiritual gift as a fruit of the Mass. If our greatest joy is to be with the Lord without end, then it makes sense that we avail ourselves of the means that will bring that desired outcome to fruition.

**Eucharistic Revival:** As you know, we started a period of **Eucharistic Revival** back in June and we continue to make that a priority in the life of our parish. By Eucharistic Revival, we mean having Catholics return to the practice of their faith; it also means a greater adherence to the Church's Eucharistic doctrine and a deepening sense of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament.

I invite you to take up this priority personally that Christ's Presence with us under the appearance of bread and wine may be better known and better loved in thought, word and action. As the year unfolds, more and more will be said about this matter from the pulpit and in this bulletin.

#### Forget them not

The commemoration of Grandparents' Day the second Sunday of September was signed into law by President Carter in 1978. On this day we honor elders who fill in as parents. Oprah Winfrey, Carol Burnett, Jack Nicholson, Maya Angelou, Willie Nelson, and Presidents Obama and Clinton are among the 2 percent of U.S. children raised by grandparents. The designated flowers for this day are forget-me-nots, a clever reference to how elders can be overlooked in a fast-paced world. These elders also reclaim the overlooked, providing encouragement for the lost sheep in our family systems. Honor your grandparents, living and deceased.

#### Monday, Sep 12, 2022

#### A name for the ages

Mary, the mother of Jesus, is known to us by many names and titles: Virgin Mary, Blessed Mother, Our Lady, Queen of Heaven, Star of the Sea, Mystical Rose, Untier of Knots, Cause of Our Salvation—and the list goes on. Catholics venerate her actual name "Mary" because it belongs to the mother of God. In the Aramaic language that she and Jesus spoke, her name was pronounced "Mariam," and by some accounts it meant "bitterness." Mary knew terrible suffering as well as great joy. Whatever you are going through, you can bring it to Mary and call on her for help—by any and all of her names. Say a Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary today.

MEMORIAL OF THE MOST HOLY NAME OF MARY TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 11:17-26, 33: Luke 7:1-10 (443). "I did not consider myself worthy to come to you; but say the word and let my servant be healed."

#### Tuesday, Sep 13, 2022

#### Nearer my God to Thee-times three

Beauty, goodness, and truth—known in theology as the "three transcendentals"—naturally uplift humans toward the Divine. Saint John Chrysostom tapped all three. His preaching was so beautiful that he earned the name *Chrysostom*os, meaning "golden mouth." As archbishop of Constantinople, he exemplified goodness by using his household budget to take care of the poor and build hospitals. But it was John's tapping of biblical truth—admonishing the wealthy and politicians for abuses of privilege and prestige—that got him into hot water with the powers that be, ultimately contributing to his death. Which of these transcendentals speaks most to your heart?

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 27-31a; Luke 7:11-17 (444). "Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

#### Wednesday, Sep 14, 2022

#### Cross purposes

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrating three historic events in early church history: the finding of the True Cross in the Holy Land in the early fourth century by Saint Helena, the mother of Constantine (himself a saint in the calendars of the Eastern Catholic Churches); the dedication of what would become the Church of the Holy Sepulchre that same year; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem after it was taken by the Persians in 614. The feast is most obvious in the Eastern Churches

(Catholic, Orthodox, and otherwise) and features small processions and veneration of a large cross during and after the liturgy. Make sure to pay special attention to the Passion of Christ today, regardless of your tradition!

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS TODAY'S READINGS: Numbers 21:4b-9; Philippians 2:6-11; John 3:13-17 (638). "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him."

#### Thursday, Sep 15, 2022

#### Mary understands your pain

In scripture, when Jesus is presented in the temple, Simeon notes that Mary's heart will be pierced. Later when Jesus recognizes her presence at the foot of the cross as he is dying, Simeon's prediction is fulfilled. Mary's steadfast faith during the ordeal of the Crucifixion serves as a beacon for anyone who suffers. Because today is the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows, it's an appropriate moment to ask Mary—who understands pain so well—to pray for our suffering loved ones and all who are enduring great trials.

MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (446); John 19:25-27 or Luke 2:33-35 (639). "Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene."

#### Friday, Sep 16, 2022

#### ¡Vivan las buenas noticias!

On Sept. 16, 1810, after being stymied in his efforts to promote economic advancement for his parishioners, Jesuit Father Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla stood in the town square of Dolores in New Spain and declared what became known as *El Grito de Dolores* ("The Cry of Dolores"): "Long live religion! Long live our Blessed Mother of Guadalupe! Long live America and death to bad government!" Thus, the Mexican War for Independence began. Today is a good day to continue the fight for economic justice. Consider beginning with morning Mass, for as Saint Cyprian wrote to his friend Pope Cornelius: "It is not only the weak but the strong who need defense... strengthening them for combat with the Body and Blood of Christ!" MEMORIAL OF CORNELIUS, POPE, AND CYPRIAN, BISHOP,

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 15:12-20; Luke 8:1-3 (447). "Jesus journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news."

#### Saturday, Sep 17, 2022

#### Worth the wait

To be named a saint, one must complete the official Roman canonization process, right? Well, not exactly. Today's saint, Hildegard of Bingen, was entered into the process four times. But all the lengthy examinations and documentations were never completed. So she remained beatified but not canonized for almost a thousand years! Yet, many popes, including John Paul II, referred to her as Saint Hildegard. Finally, in 2012, Benedict XVI promoted her to sainthood in a process called "equivalent canonization" that cuts through all the red tape. And he named her a doctor of the church to boot. Your faithful witness will be recognized—even if it takes a thousand years!
