We light the third candle on the Advent wreath today. Its color is different from the others. Why is that?

To answer that question, we refer to Scripture, in particular the New Testament. In Saint Paul's Letter to the Philippians, the apostle writes: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice." (Gal 4:4) It was the Introit for Mass on the Third Sunday of Advent every year. We have since referred to the Third Sunday of Advent as *Gaudete Sunday*, coming from the Latin word "*gaudium*," which means joy. We rejoice at the nearness of the Lord's coming today.

The color for *Gaudete Sunday* is rose. And, thus, the priest may wear a rose-colored chasuble today in honor of the Lord's nearness to us in His birth. The Messiah's birth brings Divinity to earth and makes it possible for us to go to heaven. Joy is the proper response to this gift of redemption and it fills our hearts when we celebrate the Lord's Nativity – this year and every year!

Joy fills our hearts too when we participate in **Lessons and Carols** on the Fourth Sunday of Advent (December 18th). Join us in the church at 4:00 PM for this wonderful spiritual exercise. It consists of readings from Sacred Scripture and hymns characteristic of awaiting the Messiah's arrival and being grateful for His coming in the fulness of time. This second edition of **Lessons and Carols** at Saint Margaret will go about one hour.

There is a reception immediately following **Lessons and Carols** in the church basement. Kindly join with us and other parishioners for a collation or gathering as we all begin our last preparations for Christmas.

By now, parishioners should have received the Christmas schedule in the mail. Please make a note of it as it has changed slightly since last year. There will be a single Mass at 4:00 PM on Saturday, December 24th. It will be in the church. There is **no** Mass in the church basement at 4:00 PM.

As always, I ask that parishioners be **generous** in their gift to Saint Margaret for Christmas. We do not have other sources of income to pay salaries and bills of various kinds. The bills are not easy for us to absorb – coming as they do all the time for repairs and replacements. Our budget is lean and we have no idea how much snow we will get this winter. So, please help us as best you can. We are always grateful for your financial assistance.

With Christmas coming soon, we also anticipate the start of a new calendar year. On January 1st, we mark the **Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God**. Our schedule then is not any different from our regular weekend schedule. Masses are all at their regular times. Join us at Mass as we look to heaven for blessings to help us as we make our earthly pilgrimage to heaven. What better way to be earthly pilgrims than to follow the way of the Blessed Mother in her discipleship of the Lord.

That pushes the **Solemnity of the Epiphany** to the 8th of January. And then the Christmas season comes to an end on the 9th of January with the **Feast of the Lord's Baptism**.

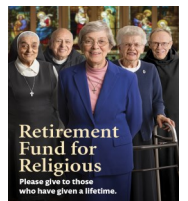

LESSONS and CAROLS

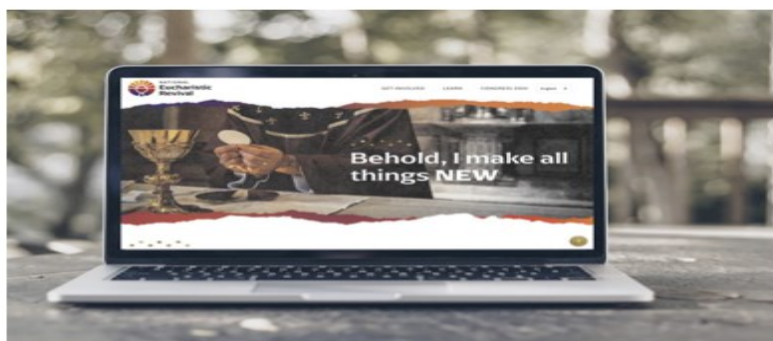
Sunday, December 18th ~ 4:00 PM
