

In the Easter season, we continue to reflect on the Lord's Resurrection and its meaning in our lives now and for all eternity. As we do that, we should be mindful of events and occurrences which are taking place now and in the next few weeks.

First, as you read in last week's column, a celebration in honor of the parish's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is about two months away. I am referring to the Mass at 11:00 AM (a special time for a Sunday given our regular schedule), a procession (outdoors, weather permitting) with the Blessed Sacrament (concluding with Benediction) and then a reception on parish grounds. The date is June 11<sup>th</sup> and the Church marks the Solemnity of Corpus Christi that day.

All parishioners of Saint Margaret are cordially invited to join us for the Mass, the Procession and the Reception. Starting last weekend and continuing for several more weekends, members of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee are in the vestibule before and after all weekend Masses to accept reservations. There is a very modest charge of \$15.00 per person to cover the cost of food, beverages and the cost of rentals for things like outdoor tents.

All those who participate in ministries and apostolates are asked to be with us on June 11<sup>th</sup> when there will be a renewal of commitment at the conclusion of Mass. There will also be a photographer on hand who will take pictures which will later be published in the journal for the **75th Anniversary** of the parish.

Second, this weekend there will be an **Exhibit of Eucharistic Miracles** on display here at Saint Margaret. The Exhibit can be viewed in the auditorium on the lower level of the church. The best time for the viewing is **before** or **after** Mass. We are having this event at Saint Margaret as part of our observance of the **Eucharistic Revival** which began last year in our nation and continues through next year.

I invite all of our parishioners to view the Exhibit and then to tell your friends and neighbors about it too. We remember that we must have a consciousness about evangelizing with the Holy Eucharist in mind. That, after all, is the reason for the **Revival** in the first place. That we have not done very much of this evangelizing in the last few decades explains why so many Catholics don't attend Mass and don't believe in the Real Presence.

Third, with the month of May not far off at this point, I call attention to something begun last year and continuing this year. I am referring to the **May Crowning of the outdoor statue of Our Lady on our property.** It is held on the Second Sunday of the month of May, which is Mother's Day. This year, it is May 14<sup>th</sup> and the crowning occurs after the 12 noon Mass.

As always, all parishioners are invited to join us for the May Crowning. We will process from the church after Mass is over to the grotto where the Crowning will take place. During the movement from the church to the grotto, we will sing Marian hymns and one of our First Holy Communicants will place the crown on the head of the statue of Our Lady.

We call upon the parents of this year's First Holy Communion Class to bring your First Holy Communicant to the 12 noon Mass. Seating will be in a reserved section of the church for the First Holy Communicants and their families on May 14<sup>th</sup>.

One last point if I may.

The elevator in the church, as you may know, has not been in use for several months. You will want to know that the elevator, decades old at this point, has been looked at by employees of the company which had been repairing it over all that time. I was informed by the president of the company in writing that the elevator cannot be repaired any more. It has to be replaced. We are currently looking at our options. A replacement of the elevator is indeed a very expensive proposition. I will advise accordingly through the bulletin in the weeks to come. Stay tuned.

#### **Table manners**

Someone once said we like our heroes dead more than alive. Cesar Chavez co-founded the United Farm Workers movement but found himself denounced as a communist and surveilled by the FBI during his lifetime. Only after death was his stature recognized, and he was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Encouraged by a priest who fueled him with Catholic social teaching, Chavez was also inspired by the nonviolent resistance of Gandhi. Along with lifelong co-worker Dolores Huerta, Chavez brought national attention to an abused yet fundamental part of our work force. Support farm workers' rights and remember at every table how your food got there.

#### Seek what is hidden

Benedictine sister, best-selling author, and spiritual guide Macrina Wiederkehr was called a "master of everyday spirituality." She lived with the monastic community of St. Scholastica in Fort Smith, Arkansas and died on this day in 2020 at the age of 80. On this anniversary of her passing, let her words infuse your own everyday spirituality: "Holiness comes wrapped in the ordinary. There are burning bushes all around you. Every tree is full of angels. Hidden beauty is waiting in every crumb. . . . Real Presence is everywhere, and those with the hearts of children revel in it."

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 6:8-15; John 6:22-29 (273). "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent."

#### Tuesday, Apr 25, 2023

#### Mark left his mark

Mark wasn't a direct disciple of Jesus but was quite active in the Early Church. He was closest to Peter, the latter returning to Mark's mother's house after escaping prison. According to Saint Jerome: "Mark, the disciple and interpreter of Peter, wrote a short gospel at the request of the brethren at Rome embodying what he had heard Peter tell. When Peter had heard this, he approved it and published it to the churches to be read by his authority." Mark's short, action-packed gospel highlights the immediacy of Jesus' actions; Mark also uses the word *eutheos*—Greek for "right away"—more than 40 times. How might the Spirit be tapping you to act with immediacy?

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Peter 5:5b-14; Mark 16:15-20 (555). "Jesus appeared to the Eleven and said to them: 'Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature.' "

#### Wednesday, Apr 26, 2023

#### Don't skip this meal

The Catholic Church teaches that the "Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." As such, it is essential to feeding our spirit and showing us the way to holiness. The very act of listening to the Word, sharing our gifts, and breaking bread with others during Mass is a foretaste of God's reign, where all are welcome to the table. A U.S. Bishops-sponsored Eucharistic Revival is underway to encourage all to encounter Christ in the Eucharist

and feel healed, converted, and called to spread love of this lifegiving experience to others. Learn more about the Eucharistic Revival, which culminates in a 2024 Eucharistic Congress, at eucharisticrevival.org.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 8:1b-8; John 6:35-40 (275). "Jesus said to the crowds, 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger.' "

#### Thursday, Apr 27, 2023

#### The real deal

Today's gospel has a eucharistic theme, with talk of "living bread" and "flesh for the life of the world." One way the church emphasizes the Eucharist is its insistence on the Real Presence, that is, the core belief that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. They are not just symbols but, as Saint John Damascene wrote, the "actual deified body of the Lord." If wrestling with that concept makes your head hurt, know that the church also acknowledges this is a "mystery"—something the mind cannot fully grasp. Leave it to the heart to understand.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 8:26-40; John 6:44-51 (276). "The bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world."

#### Friday, Apr 28, 2023

#### What's in your wallet?

Stored in coin wallets, pockets, purses, jewelry boxes, and glove compartments are many hundreds of little beads. Some are held together by string or wire, others fashioned into metal "decade" rings with laminated instructional cards. No matter what form they take, each reminds us of a special prayer of the Catholic Church, the Rosary. Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort, known for his love of the Rosary, always made sure to teach people to pray the Rosary in whatever method best helps them enter into the mysteries of the life of Christ. What's your unique way of praying the beads?

Catherine of Siena had to stand firm against the objections of her parents in order to fulfill her deepest calling, which was to the religious life. The church has expressed its collective appreciation to her by bestowing the rare title of "doctor of the church" upon her.


