

Family members, please resubmit names for those who are ill. We will list them for 4 weeks, and then remove them unless told otherwise. Please note due to privacy issues, we can include names given by the individual or a health care proxy only. Thank you.

On the Second Sunday of Lent, the gospel takes us to the top of a mountain where, according to the accounts of the evangelists, Jesus is transfigured. What Jesus is doing for the apostles and for us is offering encouragement. Recall that on the First Sunday of Lent, Jesus encourages us with His rejection of Satan's temptations. In imitation of the Lord, we are free to reject temptation, too. To do that, our wills must be trained to choose the most important realities, the transcendent ones. Today, the Lord encourages us by giving us a glimpse of what the end looks like. At the end, we are transfigured. Our bodies are glorified in the Resurrection. But we must first live through the darkness of this world, a darkness brought about by our sins. May the light of divine mercy encourage us as we make our way in this valley of tears.

Speaking of encouragement, let me continue to encourage you to make time to be with us on the Monday nights of Lent for our **Holy Hours starting at 7:30 PM**. We had a good turnout last week; let's keep the attendance strong from start to finish (we go all the way through March 18th).

I call attention to the Lenten devotion of **Stations of the Cross** on the **Fridays of Lent at 12 noon in the church**. The turnout was somewhat less than stellar the last time (February 16th). Please make an effort to join us as we recall what Jesus did to save us.

I can tell you at this point we have **rehearsal dates and times for the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum**. For the liturgy on Holy Thursday night, the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, the rehearsal is on **Wednesday, March 27th at 5:30 PM**. For the liturgy on Good Friday afternoon, the Passion of the Lord, the rehearsal is on **Thursday, March 28th at 4:00 PM**. Again, I ask that all those with **liturgical roles (deacons, lectors, servers) to attend the rehearsal**. The liturgy for Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil, is on **Saturday, March 30th at 1:00 PM**.

As you know, we have a period of **Eucharistic Adoration** on **Saturday** afternoons starting at 4:00 PM until 4:45 PM. Before the 5:00 PM Mass and while confessions are heard, please make a point of coming to be with Jesus Whose Presence will be on the altar in a monstrance. Come and adore Him!

Looking ahead a bit, there will be **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** the night of Holy Thursday. It will occur after the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Kindly watch the vestibule of the church for a sign-up. The sign-up should be available by the Third Sunday of Lent – if not sooner.

Just a heads-up on a few events on the horizon. We have the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi** in early June. The Mass on Sunday the 2nd will be followed by an outdoor procession with the Blessed Sacrament. Please continue to watch the bulletin for more details. That will be preceded by a **Communion Breakfast** the last Sunday of May (the 26th). Again, please watch the bulletin for more details.

As part of our observance of the **Eucharistic Revival**, I want to call attention to the need for reverence in church at all times, whether Mass is being offered or not. And that would be for all of us too – regardless of age. There is excessive noise and it detracts from prayer and even prevents prayerful silence in the place where the Lord dwells. As part of a Lenten asceticism, I respectfully request that continuous, animated conversation be reserved for the vestibule or outside the church building.

There has been a custom in Catholic parishes of presenting a statistical summary of sacramental celebrations for the year just ended. So, I provide these figures for Saint Margaret now: 53 Baptisms, 62 First Holy Communions, 44 Confirmations, 5 Marriages and 72 Funeral Masses. What should we know about these figures? The Catholic birth rate remains low and family size is smaller than a couple of generations ago. Few Catholic adults are marrying according to the precept of the Church. A lot of weddings now take place at catering halls or at sites without a church or chapel. The least susceptible category to changing cultural *mores* happens to be funerals – although the truth be told, changes are occurring here too. Many Catholics are still buried from parish churches, but more and more of their families are taking advantage of direct cremation and perhaps not even visitation at the funeral home. Catholic Church membership is getting smaller and smaller in the United States, and those who do remain in the Church are electing to go the way of the culture and not the way of their religion. Something to mull over and wonder where the trends are leading us.
