We continue to revel in the joy of Christ's Resurrection. Today we mark the Second Sunday of Easter and we are still early in what is called the Great Fifty Days. For the Easter Season goes all the way up to the Solemnity of Pentecost, this year on May 19th. What a great opportunity is afforded us to contemplate the Easter Mystery – more than seven weeks! Let us take advantage of this wonderful opportunity to see things from the perspective of the Risen Jesus and the new life He gives to the Church.

I take advantage of this space now to thank all those who assisted us in getting ready for Easter. I am referring especially to the ushers and the lectors who had additional duties in the church and in the sanctuary because of Palm Sunday and the Sacred Triduum. Thank you for your time! I also want to commend the choir for all the time which the members gave to the parish in rehearsals, and for helping us to praise God in song so well.

As we move deeper into the Easter season, I want to mention a few matters which should interest you and call for your participation. The first is today. As I noted above, it is the Second Sunday of Easter; it is also **Divine Mercy Sunday.** All are invited to come to the church today at 3:00 PM for a commemoration of the Divine Mercy devotion.

There are a few events in May which I want to highlight now. The first would be our annual **May Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary** which comes on the Second Sunday of the month (May 12th) following the 12 noon Mass. When Holy Mass is over, we will process on our property to the grotto where the statue of Our Lady is located. I ask you to attend, and not just if you go to the 12 noon Mass. If your schedule permits, please join us as we honor our Mother because she is Jesus' mother, and that makes her the Mother of the Church too.

Our custom has been to include the First Holy Communicants. The day before, they receive their First Holy Communion. In their First Holy Communion attire, we ask them to come with their parents to the 12 noon Mass on May 12th and sit in the section of the church designated for the First Holy Communicants and their families.

The participation of the First Holy Communicants and their families that last two years in the May Crowning has been, how can I say it delicately, not very encouraging. We will continue to ask their participation because this is how the members of the Body of Christ give devotion to our Mother Who prays for us in the Communion of Saints. We will publicize the May Crowning a lot in the next few weeks.

The second event for May is something new, well not really new – actually it has been around for generations but we can't say exactly when it was last observed here at Saint Margaret. I am referring to a **Communion Breakfast** on Sunday, May 26th. The Communion refers to the Mass, and that would be at 10:00 AM. The Breakfast refers to the morning meal which will be held in the auditorium or church basement immediately following the Mass.

All are invited to join us. We will be publicizing the event the remainder of April. We begin selling tickets for the Breakfast in early and mid-May (May 4th/5th and May 11th/12th). Tickets are \$10.00 per person. These tickets are available in the vestibule of the church **after all Masses on those two weekends just cited.** Please continue to watch the bulletin for more details.

Less than two months away now is the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi**. The date is **June 2nd**. As we observed Corpus Christi last year, we will again this year. it will involve a celebration of the Holy Eucharist and a **Procession with the Blessed Sacrament immediately following Mass**. That **Procession will be on the route we used last year**. Again, more details will be available in the coming weeks. I ask only that you reserve the date on your calendar now.

All of those in liturgical ministries – lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion – and catechists are asked to attend the 10:00 AM Mass. A pledge of re-commitment will be made by all three groups at the Mass.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a most important observance, and not only because it is celebrated on a Sunday when **Catholics are required to attend Mass.** We are currently in the midst of a **Eucharistic Revival** in the United States. The Holy Eucharist is the irreplaceable center of Catholic life because it is Christ with us as He promised ever since the Last Supper. We go to Mass habitually because the Lord Himself is there all the time.
